#### REFLECTION ON TODAY'S GOSPEL Lk 10:1-12, 17-20

In today's Gospel passage from Luke, we find our Lord appointing disciples to go out and prepare others to receive His invitation into the Kingdom of God. Every verse has something to say about the way a Christian steward should approach others. Let's look at least one of the coaching tips Christ gives.

"The Lord appointed seventy-two others whom He sent out ahead of Him in pairs to every town and place He intended to visit." In His wisdom, Christ sent His disciples out not as individuals but in pairs, as teams. This approach to evangelization certainly provided practical advantages. The disciples could lean on each other for mutual support and encouragement, helping each other to stay on task and to put their heads together to pray and problem-solve. This teamwork approach is just as relevant to us modern-day Christian stewards. It takes courage and commitment to go out and invite others into the Christian life. We need to work together to do it well.

But there is also symbolic importance to working in teams. It points to the reality that when we invite others to embrace the Good News of the Gospel, we are not merely inviting them into a belief system, but into a relationship with Christ and through that relationship, into Christ's family — our fellow Christian disciples near and far.

Our parish is our immediate spiritual family in this extended worldwide fold. We are not meant to live as isolated individuals within the parish any more than we are meant to live in isolation within our families. We are meant to be a community. That is why it is so important for us to foster a vibrant, supportive, welcoming parish life. This is why we emphasize hospitality as one of the pillars of stewardship. It is not enough just to point others to Christ, we must invite them to join us in community with Him; we must offer a place and mission for them in the Church and within our parish family.

### FOOD PANTRY REPORT

The Food Pantry Committee members are: Francisco and Debbie Javar (Chair), Haunani Hashimoto and Gladys Nelson (Assistants). They reopened our pantry on September 28, 2018. They have found it rewarding to serve our church and the community, and the people are very appreciative of this service. We thank them for their stewardship and thank parishioners for their donations. Approximately 22 individuals are served per visit and 382 total have been served since last September. This number consists of 171 individuals between the ages of 18 and 60 yrs, 144 children under 18 yrs and 67 seniors. Each month has brought new recipients. Up to this point the bulk of the food has been received from the County Food Basket with some recipients bringing their own produce to share. Beginning this month, more items will be purchased from Costco as there is money budgeted for that purpose. Please invite anyone you know who may qualify for this assistance to come. **Next distribution will be Friday, June 12, 9 to 10 am.**

# Mass Intentions for the Week

## FAITH FORMATION

### WHAT IS ORDINARY TIME?

Ordinary Time is not really “ordinary” at all. It was given the name from the Latin word “ordinalis, which refers to numbers in a series, then from the Latin word “ordo” from which we get the English word “order”. So, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time represent the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ. This is why the first Gospel in Ordinary Time always features either John the Baptist’s acknowledgment of Christ as the Lamb of God or Christ’s first miracle at the wedding of Cana. For Catholics, Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Jesus, the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives. The liturgical color is green, which is a symbol of life and of hope.

#### From USCCB:

“Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ. Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.”

### HOW WE SHOULD PREPARE FOR MASS A Series from Creighton University, Part One

All of us have, at one time or another, had the experience of being there at the beginning of Mass and feeling many miles away. It can seem that we are totally distracted by everything, anything going on around us, and by a long list of things, emotions, memories, that find their way into our consciousness the minute Mass starts. This very common experience offers us the opportunity to reflect upon what we can do to make our experience of Mass much richer, enjoyable, and helpful for our faith life.

### FEAST OF OUR PARISH PATRON SAINT

Thursday, July 11th is the Memorial Feast of St. Benedict of Nursia. He was born in 480, died in 543, and was canonized in 1220 by Pope Honorius III. His twin sister is Saint Scholastica. Benedict founded the monastery at Monte Cassino which became the roots of the Church’s monastic system. Benedict had the holiness and ability to take this step. His beliefs and instructions on religious life were collected in what is now known as the Rule of Saint Benedict, still directing religious life after 15 centuries.
