St. Benedict Catholic Church Sunday, April 29, 2018 Fifth Sunday of Easter



St. John captures the essence of what kind of love is expected from us toward our neighbor and those in need as he opens our Second Reading with "Let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth." Jesus made that point several times in His own teachings. It follows the old adage that "Actions speak louder than words."

We have pointed out numerous times that being a good steward requires action. It may be easy for us come to an understanding of what it

means to love one another; and additionally, we may speak of doing it; but the true measure is what we do, how we live our lives.

The best examples of stewardship of that we may be aware in our parishes and community involve what we see and experience in others. That is the most effective way to be taught and it is the best way to teach others. Do it and live it.

That is John's point is it not? He continues his instructions in the Second Reading by saying, "We should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ, and love one another as He commanded us." The Norwegian playwright and poet Henrik Ibsen, who had a great appreciation for the written word, once stated, "A thousand words will not leave so deep an impression as one deed."

The point of Jesus' Parable of the Two Sons (Mt 21) in which one son says he will do his father's will but does not while the other says he will not obey, but repents and does what his father asked, is quite clear that deeds mean more than intentions.

DEACON'S CORNER - Craig Camello-

A Living Sacrament...

We find a beautiful and powerful representation of this truth in the sacraments. Every sacrament has two parts. The first part is known as

the matter, or the material. In **baptism**, the matter is **water**, sprinkled, poured, or flowing. For the **Eucharist**, the matter is unleavened bread and simple wine.

The **second** part of the sacrament is known as the **form**. This is the **words** that indicate what the material is being **used** for, and when the words are pronounced over the material, **grace is truly given**.

So when the priest says, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and the Holy Spirit," the water becomes the **sanctified substance** by which the baptized person is **cleansed** not just physically, but **spiritually**, from original sin, and really given **new birth** in Christ. And during Mass when the priest says the **words of consecration** over the bread and wine ("this is my body which will be given up for you" and "this is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant"), then the **substance** of the bread and wine **change** (this is called "transubstantiation"), and Jesus becomes **truly pre**-

sent under their appearances, in order to nourish us not just symbolically, but really - with his very own divine life.

If you have the matter without the form or the form without the matter, nothing happens. Only together do they make the sacrament, the sacred sign, given by Christ, to grant us grace. As Christians, we are called to be like living sacraments in the world, acting like followers of Christ on the outside, and truly striving to follow him in our hearts, even when no one else is looking.
