

Rita of Cascia has an amazing biography that everyone should read. The widowed mother had suffered great physical abuse at her husband's hands and mental anguish at the revengeful seekings of her sons, became Sister Rita at the age of 36. Sister Rita lived forty years as a practicing nun of poverty and doing works of mercy, charity and peace. When she entered the convent she was given one habit. She wore that habit, one habit, the remainder of her life and was buried in it. One day, as Saint Rita was kneeling in prayer before a replica of the Crucified Christ. She implored, "Oh my Jesus, let me share in Thy suffering at least by one of Thy thorns." A single thorn from the crown surrounding Jesus' head speared directly into Sister Rita's forehead. This wound bled until the end of her life. Because of her many trials and sacrifices in life St. Rita is known as the Patron Saint of Impossible Causes.
