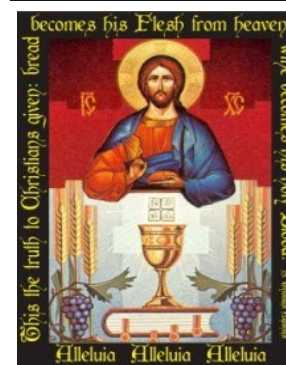

St. Benedict Catholic Church Sunday, June 3, 2018 SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST



We have had three consecutive weeks of significant Solemnities—Pentecost, Trinity Sunday, and now the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, better known by the name of Corpus Christi which translates from the Latin as the “Body of Christ.”

Clearly this is a celebration which brings our focus on the Eucharist, which is at the absolute center of our liturgy, and at the core of our Catholic faith. We have mentioned many times that all revolves around the Eucharist when we receive the real Body and Blood of the Lord.

According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (#1324), “The Eucharist is ‘the source and summit of the Christian life.’ The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself.”

The Eucharist should be the high point of our week, or even of our day. The author J.R.R. Tolkien (author of *The Hobbit* and *The Lord of the Rings* trilogy), who was a devout Catholic, once stated, “The only cure for sagging or fainting faith is Communion. Though always itself, perfect and complete and inviolate, the Blessed Sacrament does not operate completely and once for all in any of us. Like the act of Faith it must be continuous and grow by exercise. Frequency is of the highest effect. Seven times a week is more nourishing than seven times at intervals.”

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading -This is the blood of the covenant that the LORD has made with you (Exodus 24:3-8).

Psalm- I will take the cup of salvation, and call on the name of the Lord (Psalm 116).

Second Reading- Christ is the mediator of a new covenant (Hebrews 9:11-15).

Gospel -This is my body. This is my blood of the covenant (Mark 14:12-16, 22-26).

DEACON’S CORNER -Craig Camello-
Conditions of receiving the Eucharist...
The holy Eucharist is the continuing redemption of the world through Christ's real presence among and within us. This helps us understand why the Church is so respectful of this most Blessed Sacrament. In receiving Christ in its purest form we come to Holy Communion with a clean heart by going to confession. When we sin, especially a mortal sin, it is a major rebellion against God. For example, an employee who embezzles or steals from his or her company by deceiving, lying, and breaking laws, is committing a serious injustice, a mortal sin. In their own conscious they are not doing good, but are doing evil. If they receive Holy Communion without having confessed and repented, they are insulting God, who is pure goodness and justice, thus committing another sin of disrespect. God gave us confession because he knows that we will need it. He wants to give us a way to empty our souls of the resentment of sin and selfishness, so that he can fill them with the sweet wine of his grace, especially through the Eucharist.

In subtle ways where we find ourselves more frequently, venial or minor sins are different when we lose our temper because we have had a hard week at work and show a sense of frustration and anger towards someone, this is still wrong. After all, Jesus didn't lose his temper on the cross. This is not a major rebellion against God, and so it shouldn't keep us from receiving Communion. In fact, Holy Communion is one way God offers us forgiveness and healing from our sins. So in this Eucharist celebration let’s open our hearts to this truly amazing gift of Christ's own body and blood given to us as spiritual nourishment, and let's promise to always do our best to receive this gift with humility, reverence, and joy.
