St. Benedict Catholic Church Sunday, August 5, 2018 Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the Gospel from John, Jesus advises us, "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." By calling Himself the Bread of Life, Jesus is telling us by what He says, how He acts, and in fact Who He is that He is the Word of God made flesh.



God reveals to us the Word alive in the most complete way possible, through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We are to hear the Word and know Who Jesus is; we are to accept that Word into our minds and hearts — into our spirit — and we are to let that Word begin to change us.

That change is represented by knowing what God wants us to do. Today's Holy Scriptures make that clear. We must pray that we respond and do be good stewards of our time, talent, and treasure so that we can do the work God wants us to do. In the Second Reading, Paul reminds us that we need to undergo a conversion — in effect put on a new self. Our entire lives need to be devoted to change, so that we renew ourselves from the inside and live a steward-ship way of life according to God's ways.

Charles Spurgeon, an English minister in the 1800s once wrote, "Conversion is a turning onto the right road. The next thing to do is to walk on it." That is our trial. Once we experience conversion, we must follow through by doing what the Lord wishes us to do.

FIVE PRECEPTS OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH This is the <u>fourth</u> of the five Precepts.

"You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church."

"The fourth precept ensures the times of ascesis and penance which prepare us for the liturgical feasts and help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart." Children under 18, the elderly over 59, and pregnant or nursing women do not have to fast on normal fast days (Ash Wednesday and Good Friday).

"The Church uses these precepts to remind us that Christian life requires a commitment to prayer and active participation in the liturgy and sacraments.

of Christ" and respond "Amen" without thinking much about how incredible it is that we are receiving God into our hearts under the appearance of bread. Whenever we genuflect in front of a tabernacle, and that little red lamp is glowing nearby, we acknowledge our faith that Our Lord is sacramentally present in the Eucharist. In today's Gospel Jesus is trying to move us from thinking of ordinary bread in our stomachs to thinking of the bread of life. Our Lord today is asking us to go from what we understand of bread and the thought of endless bread to what we are really looking for: eternal life, not just as living forever, but as living happily forever. When we consider our needs and our expectations for God to help fulfill us, we can never lose sight of our ultimate need God has given us to fulfill it: believing in his son and receiving him as the Bread of Life. Let's try believing even when understanding something God teaches us is challenging, knowing he is always trying to provide for our eternal needs, not just our short-term ones. May the Body of Christ fill you with his Love and Grace!
