St. Benedict Catholic Church Sunday, August 12, 2018 Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"This is enough. O Lord! Take my life." Talk about a bad day! Haven't we all been through this at some point in our stewardship journey, whether in the parish ministry work we are trying to do, at home with our family or in our profession — we get worn out and worn down.

Elijah's plea — melodramatic to be sure — is a form of the stewardship pillar of prayer, for prayer is simply lifting mind and heart to God. And God responds, sending restorative food and drink. Rejuvenated, Elijah is able to walk for 40 days until he arrives at the destination God had in mind for him all along!

Contrast this with the Gospel reading. The people, hearing Jesus' message, do not understand. But rather than take their complaint to Him as Elijah did, they begin to complain amongst themselves about him — that's murmuring, and it is counterproductive.

Feeling worn down at times is actually part of the stewardship journey.


DEVOTION TO OUR BLESSED MOTHER

FORMATION

FIVE PRECEPTS OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH This is the fifth of the five Precepts.

"You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church." The fifth precept means that the faithful are obliged to assist with the material needs of the Church each according to his own ability. The Church uses these precepts to remind us that Christian life requires a commitment to prayer and active participation in the liturgy and sacraments.

Activating Our Faith in the Eucharist...

Faith is connected to the Eucharist because it reveals Christ's presence to us, but it also connects us in another way. Physical food nourishes our bodies by the act of eating. As soon as we swallow our food, our digestive system takes over and we don't have to think about it. Not so with the spiritual food of the Eucharist. If we receive the Eucharist out of habit or in a distracted frame of mind, then we will not receive all the grace that God wants to give us. On the other hand, when we receive the Eucharist with the right dispositions, God's grace will have more room to act, strengthening our souls and making our spirits grow. Faith, a lively, deep, and solid faith, is part of this right disposition. As we pray before the tabernacle or as we come forward to receive Holy Communion, we activate our faith in our minds and hearts to seek his presence in our lives. We should focus our attention as completely as possible on Jesus Christ, the living bread who has come down from heaven to be our spiritual food. And then, immediately after receiving Holy Communion, we should enter into a conversation with him in our hearts. This is why the Church invites us to have some time of silence after Communion, so that we can activate our faith and spiritually digest the living bread. Remember, it is the Father who draws us to his Son; it is God who gives us the gift of faith. So if we need a faith-boost, all we have to do is ask for it, saying, humbly and confidently, "Lord, increase my faith, so that your grace can bear

more fruit in my life."
