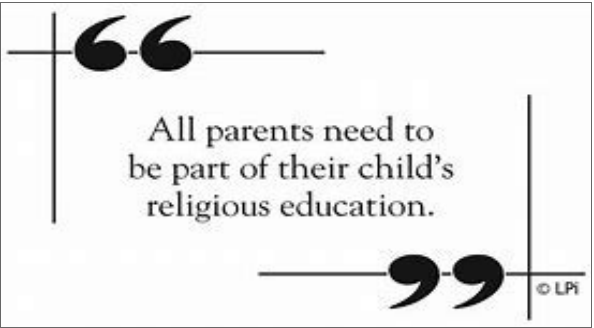


EVANGELISM AND CATECHESIS
