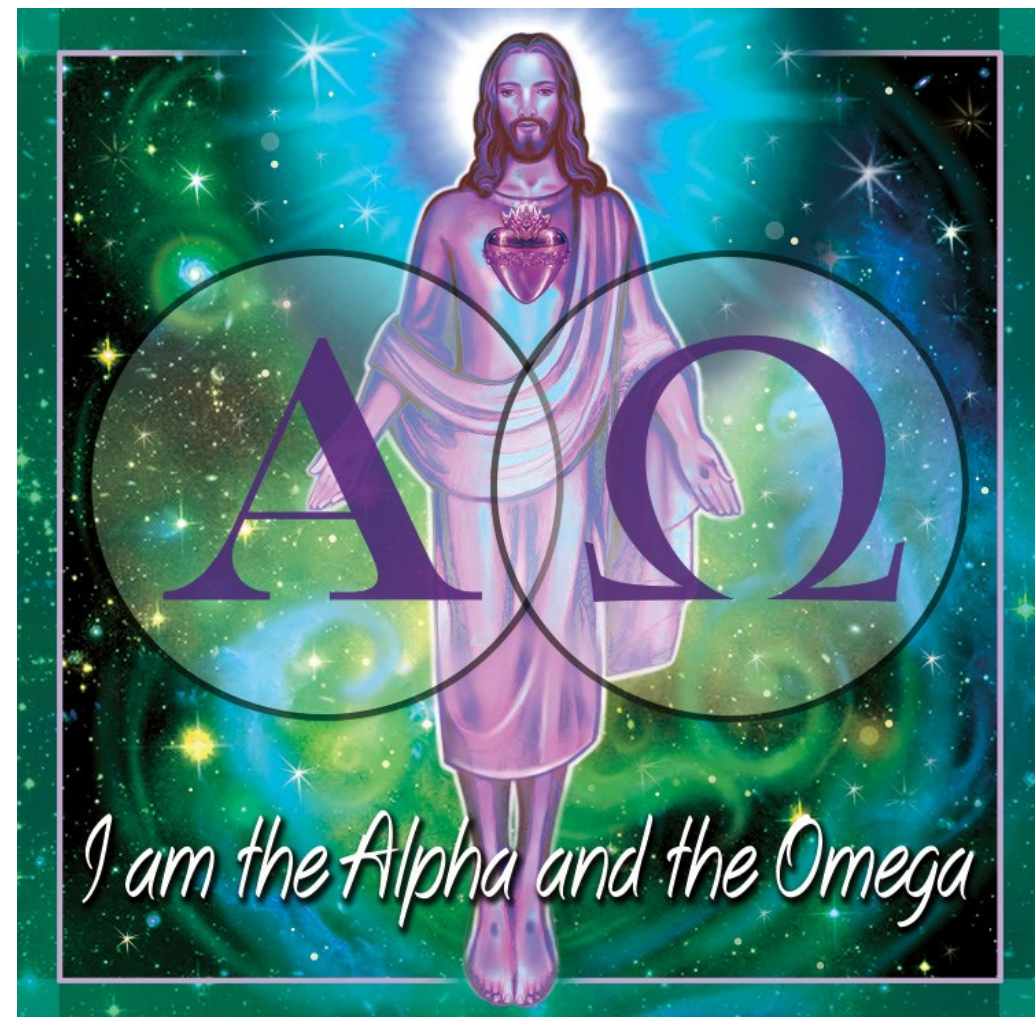

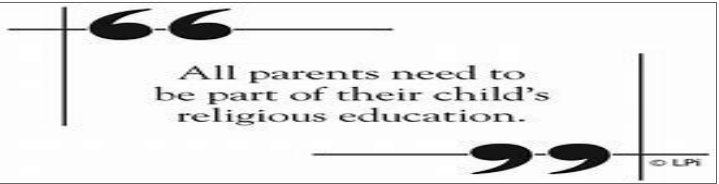

DEACON’S CORNER
Three Ways of Understanding "Truth"
*There are three ways to understand the word
"truth." And the fundamental truth that "God is
love" fits into all three. First, truth can refer to facts,
to the way things are. Jesus on the cross
bears witness that God’s primary identity is love,
self-giving, and goodness. Second, truth can refer
to morality, to the right way of behaving. Obedience
to God's will, to His commandments, is the source of
our spiritual health and abundance; it is how we en-
ter into a loving relationship with Him. And third,
truth refers to dependability and honesty. When we
say a friend is true, we mean we can count on them.
And Jesus on the cross proves without any doubt
that God is trustworthy. God is love, it's a fact and
a moral standard to trust. This is the truth that
will set us free from sin and lead us into the eternal
Kingdom, if we accept it. He is the Way, the Truth,
