VERY IMPORTANT NOTICE— PLEASE READ!!

The diocesan task force responding to the new state law permitting assisted suicide will hold "Sessions for Explanation, Discussion and Questions" related to *Instruction Regarding Sacraments and Funerals in Situations involving Physician Assisted Suicide*, issued by the bishop in November. The new law goes into effect on January 1, 2019. These sessions are for the following people:

- All priests and deacons
- Parish Staff
- Those involved in ministry to the sick and home bound
- Those involved in funeral and bereavement
- ministry

Each session will last at most 90 minutes. Our vicariate's session will be at St. Michael's Church 10:00 a.m. January 14th.
