St. Benedict Catholic Church Sunday, March 10, 2019 First Sunday of Lent



Let's face it, many have gotten somewhat sloppy about going to Mass on Sundays. Why? We're so busy. The kids won't sit still. I need my sleep. God knows I love Him. God loves us whether we go or not. So, what difference does it make??

Without Mass, how can we live a Catholic and Christian life? We are not giving God the love and focus that God should have in our lives. (Third Commandment-Remember, thou keep holy the Lord's Day-). We are not growing in the Word of God. We are not receiving the greatest gift that Jesus left us, His own true Body and Blood. We are not contributing to building up the community of Christ by our presence, witness and service. We are depriving our children of the intimate knowledge of God which they deserve. We deprive ourselves of a profound sense of peace and love. We are weakening the Christian faith.

Make a new plan to put God first in your life. Give what God deserves and receive what you need...nourishment for your heart and spirit. Going to Mass draws us from the self-absorption of our lives and directs us to the grace and power of God. As a Catholic nothing is more important to your salvation than the Eucharist! Pray about this during the next forty days.

Parents, please remember—On all R.E. Sundays, i.e. 2nd and 4th of each month, Fr. Ornoldo asks that <u>all</u> parents remain in the church after the 9:30 Mass. He is making a great effort in catechesis and evangelization of those who are the FIRST teachers of the faith to their children.

DEACON'S CORNER -Craig Camello-

Every person in this Church is part of the Body of Christ. The Eucharist unites us with God and with each other. So when we put another person first we're putting God first. And Lent is a perfect time to renew this effort, counting on God's help. The Catechism says that when we receive the Body of Christ and say "Amen," we're saying something amazing. We're saying: "Yes, I believe that I belong to Christ, and I believe that everyone else in this church also belongs to him." That means that we have a responsibility to others: we serve Christ in them. So what can we do this week to put others first? There's a time of silence after communion. We can use this time to ask Jesus to show us one person we can put first this week. Maybe it's a spouse or a coworker or a friend who needs support. We can resolve to pray for that person each day this week. And then we could pick one way to reach out to him or her this week. When Jesus is tempted in the desert he puts his Father first. And when we put others first we're putting God first. Jesus will give us the strength – all we have to do is ask. Let this be the BEST LENT EVER!
