WE ARE TO BE TRANSFORMED

Today's showing forth of God's glory is filled with a light that astonishes and reveals. Jesus transfigured on Mount Tabor energizes even the sleepy apostles, who see but cannot get hold of it. They can be forgiven for not apprehending the full meaning of this extraordinary vision of a transfigured Jesus with Elijah and Moses. The whole of the Law and prophets is summed up here on this mountain.

The transfiguration on Mount Tabor is handed over to us this Sunday. As Paul reminds us, it is we who are to be transformed. The light and life of the Resurrection are set forth here so we do not lose heart and fall entirely asleep. This Sunday looks to Easter. It looks to transformation. It asks us to lift up our heads and acknowledge the risen Lord as our light and our salvation.

DEVOTION TO OUR BLESSED MOTHER

2019 CHRISM MASS-BLESSING OF OILS

On March 28, 2019 the Chrism Mass will be celebrated at St. Joseph Church, Hilo, beginning at 6:00 p.m. It's a long drive, but if you have not been to a Chrism Mass, you should try to go. It is a very solemn Mass where all our priests will stand and renew their priestly vows with Bishop Larry. He will bless containers of the three oils to be used for the next year. Oil of the Sick is for the sacramental Anointing of the Sick, for healing of the body, mind and soul. Oil of the Catechumens is used for the anointing of those preparing for baptism, to strengthen them to resist the power of Satan and reject evil in all its forms. The sacred Chrism is mixed with perfume (usually balsam) by the Bishop and then consecrated by him. It is used to anoint infants after Baptism, those who are to be confirmed, Bishops and Priests at their Ordination, and altars and churches at the time of their dedication. Parishioners from every parish on the island will be there to accept the oils.

DEACON'S CORNER Inserting a Daily God-Time

One excellent way to remind ourselves of Lent is to commit to having a daily God-time. This means taking a few minutes every day just to spend with God. We never let a day go by without taking a shower, because we know our bodies need cleansing. We never let a day go by without eating, because we know our bodies need nourishment. Many people almost never let a day go by without exercising, because they know their bodies need stimulation. Why not do the same for our souls? It's simple and quite easy. Choose a time and place in which you won't be **interrupted or bothered**, then do three things: First, Remember. Remind yourself that your citizenship is in heaven that Christ has set you aside to be his ambassador in this world. Second, Read. Take out a spiritual book, a Bible, or your favorite prayer book and read a paragraph or two, slowly. And Third, Reflect. Think about what you read. Listen to what God wants to say to you through it and apply it to your life.

Remember, Read, Reflect, and you will have received a word of encouragement from God to help you be faithful to your true identity – to help you "stand firm in the Lord." In the end, that's the only thing that really matters.
