St. Benedict Catholic Church Sunday, April 7, 2019 Fifth Sunday in Lent



What should we be preparing for? Reconciliation! In today's gospel the Pharisees and scribes present a challenge to Jesus— they want to see if Jesus will condemn the adulterous woman or not. The woman's situation is certainly serious. But a message flows directly from it: In whatever condition we find ourselves, we can always open ourselves to conversion and receive forgiveness for our sins. "Neither do I condemn you; go, and do not sin again" (Jn 8: 11).

Jesus did not condemn the woman, but he also did not overlook her sin. He told her to go and leave her life of sin. He called her to a new and transformed life. Is Jesus calling you to repent from sin? Are you ready to accept his forgiveness and begin a new life?

On Calvary, by the supreme sacrifice of his life, the Messiah will seal for every man and woman the infinite gift of God's pardon and mercy.

DEVOTION TO OUR BLESSED MOTHER

Every Friday of Lent held at St. Benedict, 3:00 p.m. outdoors, and at St. John the Baptist, 7:00 p.m.

FIVE STEPS TO A GOOD CONFESSION

- 1. Examine your conscience.** When we examine our conscience, we think about whether the choices we have made showed love for God, ourselves, and others. We ask ourselves whether we have sinned, either by doing something that we know is against God's law, or by not doing something that God's law calls us to do.
- 2. Be sincerely sorry for your sins.** We express heartfelt sorrow. We tell God we are truly sorry for our sins and firmly intend not to sin again. We say the Act of Contrition.
- 3. Confess your sins to a priest.** Simply tell your sins to the priest. He may ask you questions or give you advice.
- 4. Resolve to amend your life.** True contrition for sins is more than an emotion of remorse for sin. True contrition means that we intend to live differently from now on.
- 5. After your confession, do the penance the priest assigns.** Perform your penance as soon as possible. Spend some time with Our Lord thanking and praising Him for the gift of His mercy.

Prayer After Confession

Merciful Lord, with a pure heart I thank you for taking away my sins and I renew my desire to be your faithful friend and servant, increase my loving dependence on you, and grant me that joy and peace of heart which comes from doing your holy will. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
