**WHAT DOES MOTU PROPRIO MEAN? (Fact of Faith)**

On September 30, 2019, Pope Francis issued his Apostolic Letter, *Aperuit illis*, "motu proprio." In it, he establishes that "the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God." According to the Vatican, the timing of the document's release is significant: September 30 is the Feast of Saint Jerome, who is a Biblical scholar, well-known for his translation of the Bible into Latin.

**So what does "Motu proprio" mean and why is it important?**

The words "Motu proprio" signify that the provisions of the rescript were decided on by the pope personally, that is, not on the advice of the cardinals or others, but for reasons which he himself deemed sufficient. Ultimately, as Catholic News Service states, "Popes use it to signal a special personal interest in the subject."

The pope is both a spiritual and legislative leader. A document is released "motu proprio" when the pope wants to change, update or enact an existing church rule. Legislative changes made by a pope overrule decisions by other Vatican departments, therefore even small changes to church law established in documents issued "motu proprio" can be significant.
