REFLECTING ON THE BLESSED SACRAMENT

(Part Thirteen) [Last week should have been numbered part 12]

Ending Mass Confusion. The final term of endearment related to the Eucharist that needs to be addressed is "Mass". From the Latin word *missa*, Mass is the name we use to describe the celebration of the Sacrament of the Eucharist. The gathering of the faithful during which the Eucharist is confectioned at the altar and then distributed to the faithful as Holy Communion is called Mass. Mass requires the proper minister (Bishop or priest), the proper offerings (bread, wine), the intention of the Church and the use of the proper Ritual. There are various Mass texts to adapt to a specific day or season – but no matter when the Eucharist is celebrated, that is the Mass.

Service Stations? There are other actions related to the Eucharist that are specifically not Mass. In the absence of a Priest, some parishes may have what is commonly dubbed a "communion service." That is not Mass – no Sacrifice occurs on the altar; no sacrament is confectioned. It is merely the distribution of Holy Communion. This may only occur on Sunday, in the absence of a priest. On weekdays, when there is an unexpected absence of a priest (i.e., priest got sick, priest was in accident, etc.), a communion service may be held for those who rightly showed up for Mass (but these weekday services may not be scheduled and are not a substitute for Mass). With the priest shortage in parts of our nation today, there are areas that have a Sunday "Communion Service" (properly called, "Sunday Celebration in the Absence of a Priest") for
