A House Divided

One of the heaviest burdens people are forced to carry is the distress of "a house divided." When Abraham Lincoln said "a house divided against itself cannot stand," he was referring to the division within the country during the Civil War. We experience a similar, though not as lethal, separation when our two-party system of government engenders obstinate division—not merely acceptable political diversity. Perhaps the most heartbreaking example of a house divided is a

family in which members are alienated from each other. There are as many reasons for family division as there are families. Reasons include the betrayal of one member by another, inheritance disparity, parental favoritism, sibling rivalry, to name a few. One might think that those involved should be able to resolve such differences—after all, isn't blood thicker than water? On the other hand, how are serious family rifts to be repaired if the reason for division is one's faith or commitment to God? That is the situation that Jesus describes today. We might wonder how faith in God can tear families apart. It often happens when someone leaves the religion of one's family and converts to another tradition. This might be judged as a betrayal of the family's values. This may be what many of Jesus' Jewish followers faced when they claimed that Jesus fulfilled their religious expectations while other family members did not share their belief. That was a terrible price to have to pay for fidelity to their faith, but they paid it.

SAINT OF THE WEEK— Feast Day August 18TH SAINT HELENA OF THE TRUE CROSS

ca. 250-330



St. Helena was the mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine who seized power in the year 312 and one year later he legalized Christianity and at about this time Helena converted to Christianity. With her son's authority Helena went to Palestine in search of the sacred sites. She was a truly zealous Christian who helped to

feed and clothe the poor, giving money or supplies. She liberated some from imprisonment and also from servitude in the mines or unjust oppression. She built churches marking the place of the Nativity in Bethlehem and the site of the Ascension. Her greatest desire was to find the cross on which Jesus was hung. Constantine ordered St. Macarius, Bishop of Jerusalem to search for the cross on Mount Calvary. There was found a cistern just east of Calvary where three crosses were found and the titulus (the board with INRI inscribed by Pilate). Tradition says Helena brought a dying woman there—she touched each cross and when she touched the last one she was instantly cured, thereby identifying the "true cross". Saint Helena was a very devout servant of God and through her work Christianity spread widely through the known world. She died in 330 with her very devoted son by her side.

THE DOGMA OF THE ASSUMPTION

The Blessed Virgin's assumption into heaven, without bodily corruption and death, had been celebrated by the church for centuries, even though there was no scriptural reference for their belief. On November 1, 1950 Pope Pius XII solemnly and officially defined the Dogma of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into eaven. The infallible document is called Munificentissimus Deus (The Most Bountiful God). This declaration took place in the Piazza of St. Peter's in the presence of 40 Cardinals, 500 bishops, thousands of priests, and close to one million lay persons. In part it stated...by the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, of the Blessed Apostles Peter and Paul, and by our own authority, we pronounce, declare, and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma: that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory".

Dear Padre,

A friend told me not to worry about salvation because we're predestined to be saved or condemned. Why try to be a good person if God has already decided where I'll end up?

The idea that some people are predestined to be saved and others are damned is contrary to Catholic teaching. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says that "when therefore [God] establishes his eternal plan of 'predestination,' he includes in it each person's free response to his grace" (600; emphasis added). The Catechism (1038) also cites the parable of the separation of the sheep from the goats, in which the sheep and goats are separated not randomly, but based on their actions: "When the Son of Man comes in his glory...all the nations will be assembled before him. And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will place the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the king will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father'....And [those on the left] will go off to eternal punishment" (Matthew 25:31–46). God wants to save all people. The way we respond to God's gift of salvation is called free will. Unfortunately, not everyone accepts that gift.
