Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Thank You That I Am Better Than Others



The words of the Pharisee in today's Gospel might look like a prayer of thanksgiving. However, it is not a prayer, nor does it express gratitude. It is an arrogant statement of self-congratulation. One might think that he had a right to boast. After all, he did observe certain religious obligations and refrain from forms of public immorality. Why did Jesus say that he was not justifi ed? First, he haughtily presented himself in the temple as a prayerful man. As

we saw last week, the fundamental character of prayer is acknowledgement of human neediness and a trust in God's loving care. This man did not see himself as needy or requiring God's care. Second, he did not realize that as important as religious observance and good works might be, they are not requirements fulfi lled to earn God's love. Rather, they should fl ow from one's inner relationship with God. Third, he judged the inner disposition of others by observing the outer circumstances of their lives. On the other hand, Jesus praised the tax collector. Why? First, he acknowledged he was a sinner in need of God's mercy. After all, as tax collector, he worked for the hated Romans who occupied the land. Most likely he made his own living by adding a commission to the taxes he collected from others. Second, he made no claim of being righteous and deserving God's mercy. Third, overwhelmed by his own unworthiness, he compared himself to no one. His was genuine prayer.

SAINT OF THE WEEK- FEAST DAY OCTOBER 24TH ST. ANTHONY MARY CLARET 1807—1870




Born in Barcelona, Spain on December 23, 1807, the fifth of eleven children, he was baptized on Christmas day. His family was in the textile business which was interrupted by the start of the War of Independence when France invaded Spain a few months after Anthony's birth. The

violence and insecurity of war times did not affect him, but instead, he gained strength. At age four or five he was brave enough to go into the fighting his family had escaped and he rescued his elderly, blind grandfather who had been left behind in the darkness. Little Anton found peace and strength from the Eucharist, becoming very close to Jesus and having a special devotion to the Virgin Mary. At age twelve he hears God calling him to become a priest. He began studies but the government closed the school. So he was brought to the family business, learned weaving, and his prayer became less often and less enthusiastic. Later he felt God calling him again and he entered the Seminary of Vic, being ordained in 1835 even before finishing his studies. He remained there four years and completed his courses. He applied to become a Jesuit in Rome but four months after starting his novitiate he suffered severe pain in his right leg that prevented walking. His Father General told him it is God's will that he go back to Spain. In Catalonia, 1849, he founded the Congregation of the Missionary Sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary—later known as the *Claretians*. In 1850 He was consecrated as Bishop at the Cathedral of Vic. In 1857, Queen Elizabeth II of Spain chose him as her Confessor and he moved to Madrid, then the Queen appoints him Protector of the church and he held several other positions as a conservative. Some of his duties brought on feuds, hatred and the revenge of many. He was pursued as a criminal and went into the Cistercian monastery at Fontfroide. In this place surrounded by the love of the monks, he died on October 24, 1870 at 62 years of age. He was canonized by Pope Pius XII on May 7, 1950.

Dear Padre,

I'm tired of being distracted by children sliding around in the pews, fidgeting, and giggling with each other. How would the priest like parents to handle these situations during Mass? I presume you mean children between the ages of two and six-kids too old to be crying in their parents' arms and too young to be in religious-education programs. Many parishes have Children's Liturgy of the Word programs, but the kids still spend time at regular Mass. It's important for kids to be at Mass and to learn to be quiet for an hour. When children come to Mass, they slowly get used to the idea that they're expected to behave for a limited amount of time. Parents should bring books or soft toys—anything that won't make more noise—to keep the kids entertained. They shouldn't let their kids bring musical toys, electronic games with sound effects, or toy trucks that can be run up and down the pews. If children continue to be disruptive, parents should take them outside for a short time and then bring them back. Bottom line: Priests want children to come to Mass. It's better to have fidgeting kids at Mass than no kids at all. We want them to learn to behave now so when they get older, they're ready to deepen their participation in the Mass.
