Life Out of Focus

FR. JOSEPH JUKNIALIS

I found myself angry the other day, as we all do, I suppose, whenever we put our foot in our mouth, or forget about an important engagement, or scramble whatever it was we had hoped would be picture-perfect. What I had scrambled was a homily. For some reason, the image came out wrong, or the example did not fit, or it just did not come together the way I had hoped. And I was angry with myself to the point that it caught me off guard. It was an unexpected glimpse of what I didn't want to admit: the fact that the way people might perceive me as a preacher had taken on more importance than preaching God's word. Life had gotten out of focus. A perspective had been lost. It happens to us all in the course of our lifetimes, and more than once. Grades become more important than learning, or being right more important than the relationship, or the address of where we live more important than the people living together. It happens between parent and child when a parent places greater significance on the son's or daughter's profession than on that son's or daughter's happiness. Like in the parable of Jesus, where we sit at table takes on greater meaning than the people who gather or the meal that is shared. That is what pride does. It distorts what is real and shifts the focus of life to ourselves. The antidote? A prayerful awareness of who we are and who God is. •

Its opposite- HUMILITY brings joy, peace and encouragement to all. Humble people readily acknowledge that all the good qualities they have are gifts from God and that every success has its origin and support in Him. In this Eucharistic celebration let us ask for the grace to be truly HUMBLE. This will enable us to be GENEROUS and thereby become a source of blessings and happiness for so many of our brothers and sisters.

First Reading from the Book of Sirach 3:17-18.20.28-29

Humility, eagerness to learn real wisdom, and generosity were virtues exalted by the wise people of old like Sirach. His advice is most appropriate even in our days, for the virtues he inculcates are timeless values.

Second Reading from the Letter to the Hebrews 12:18-19.22-24

Jesus is the mediator of the New Covenant, the new relationship with God which is characterized not by fear, but by trust and communion with angels and saints.

Gospel Luke 141.7- 14

Jesus is the perfect model of humility and generosity and wants all his followers to practice these virtues. The sight of people scrambling for places of honor gives him the opportunity to inculcate these virtues in the guests and in us.


